
Getting to Yokohama

Centrally Located

Effortlessly connected, vibrant Yokohama is the perfect gateway to Japan. Less than 30 minutes from central Tokyo, with direct access to Haneda and Narita airports as well as the Tokaido Shinkansen, its location offers seamless travel to scenic Hakone, historic Kamakura, Kyoto, Osaka, and beyond.

From International Airports

Yokohama is only 30 minutes from Haneda Airport by train or Limousine bus. Narita Airport is around 90 minutes away by express train or Limousine bus.

From Central Tokyo


Yokohama lies just 25 minutes from Tokyo Station via the JR Tokaido, Yokosuka, and Keihin-Tohoku Lines; 16 minutes from Shinagawa with additional access via the Shonan-Shinjuku Line; and 25 minutes from Shibuya via the Tokyu Toyoko and JR Shonan-Shinjuku Lines.

Cruise Terminal Map

As a vibrant port city, Yokohama is served by three convenient terminals:

- **Osanbashi**, just a 10-minute drive from Yokohama Station
- **Shinko Pier**, a 10-minute drive – all offering seamless access and top-class facilities.
- **Daikoku Pier**, 30 minutes away and suited for mega ships

All three terminals are also a short drive away from the nearest Shinkansen bullet train station, Shin-Yokohama.



Flower Viewing at City Parks



The highlight of Yokohama's floral calendar is the *Garden Necklace Yokohama* event, a three month celebration which starts in spring where cherry blossoms give way to tulips, then roses, and finally hydrangeas in a floral relay across the city, including Yamashita Park and the Yokohama English Garden. There are also sweet treats inspired by the flowers of the season to enjoy.

GREEN×EXPO 2027



From March to September 2027, the International Horticultural Expo will transform 100 hectares of Yokohama into a celebration of the city's connection to flowers and greenery. Visitors can enjoy indoor and outdoor exhibits, themed pavilions, gardens that change with the season, and hands-on nature experiences. To create the Expo theme of "Scenery of the Future for Happiness," venues that represent a greener society will be developed, along with spaces for co-creation.


Sankeien Garden

Overlooked by a three-story pagoda on a small hill, Sankeien is a quintessential Japanese garden that embodies the timeless charm of traditional Japan. Covering a vast landscape of ponds, streams, waterfalls, and meandering trails, the garden is adorned with seasonal splendor throughout the year—from soft pink cherry blossoms in spring and vivid lotus blooms in summer, to fiery maple leaves in autumn and tranquil snow-covered vistas in winter. Historic teahouses and culturally significant buildings relocated from across Japan offer visitors moments of quiet reflection. Whether you're enjoying a peaceful stroll, sipping a bowl of matcha, or joining a guided tour, Sankeien provides an immersive floral retreat that exemplifies Yokohama's deep appreciation for seasonal beauty—right in the heart of Yokohama.




