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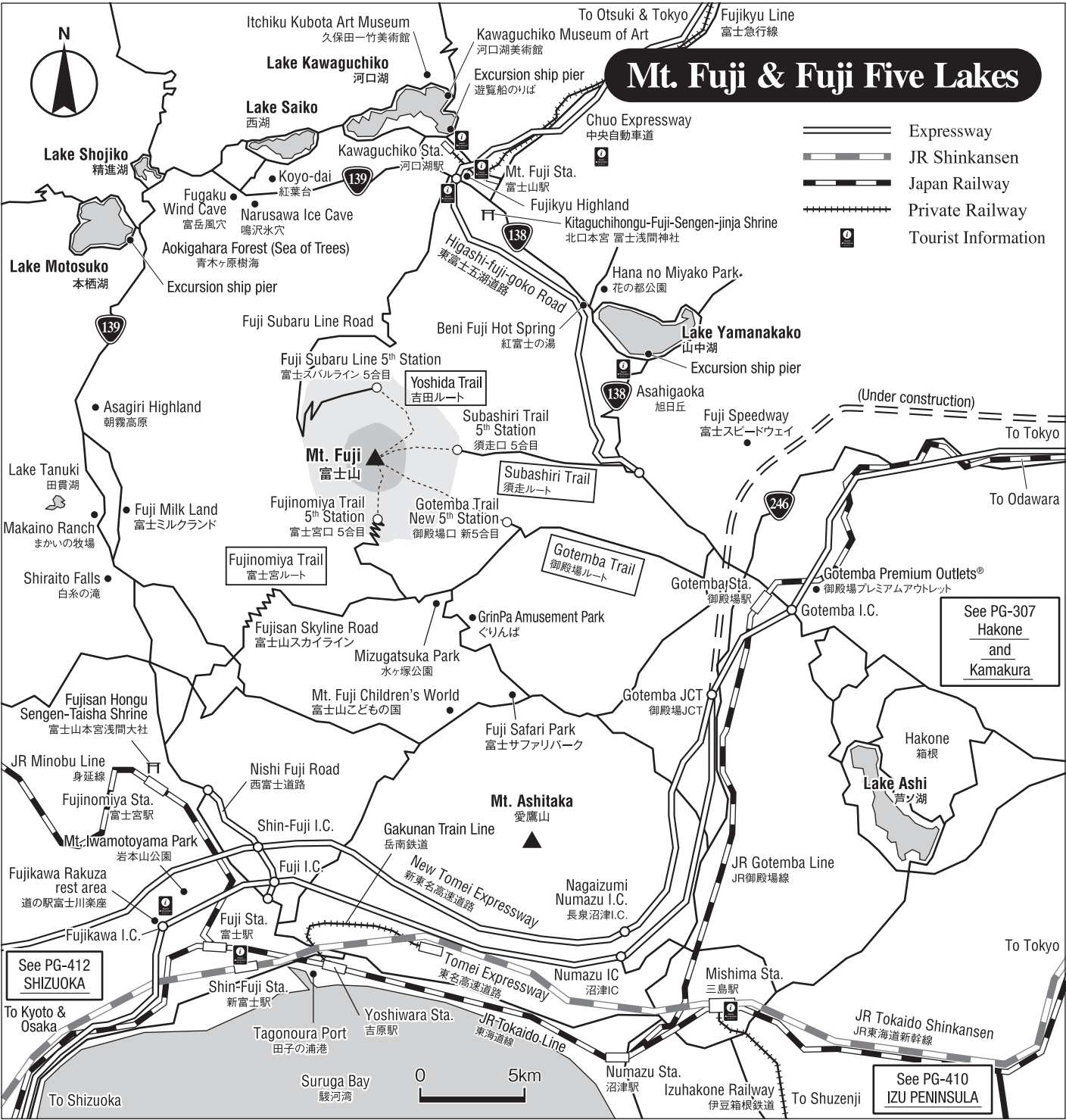

Mt. Fuji and Fuji Five Lakes (富士山、富士五湖):

Mt. Fuji, the highest mountain in Japan, is known for its beautiful shape of Konide. At the foot of the mountain and around its wide base lies a beautiful resort area replete with abundant natural scenery that includes lakes, plateaus, waterfalls and caves. This attractive sightseeing area is also dotted with amusement parks, theme parks, and sports facilities. Mt. Fuji

and Kawaguchiko stations on the Fujikyu Line are the gateways to the Fuji Five Lakes; JR's Mishima, Shin-Fuji, and Fujinomiya stations provide access to the southern and western bases of Mt. Fuji; and JR Gotemba station provides access to the eastern base.

Places of Interest in the Fuji Five Lakes Area:

■ Fuji-Yoshida

Fuji-Yoshida (富士吉田) has long flourished as the temple town of the Kitaguchihongu-Fuji-Sengen-jinja shrine. Some of its older residences can be seen on the approach to the shrine from Mt. Fuji Sta. Sightseeing points include a park with abundant greenery and museums, as well as Fujikyu Highland, an amusement park on the western outskirts of the town.

Kitaguchihongu-Fuji-Sengen-jinja Shrine (北口本宮富士浅間神社) 15 min. walk from Mt. Fuji Sta. or 5 min. by bus to Sengen-jinja-mae bus stop. Built in 788 to put the minds of local people fearing eruption of Mt. Fuji at ease, a majestic atmosphere prevails within the grounds of this venerable shrine.

■ Lake Kawaguchiko

Lake Kawaguchiko (河口湖) is located in the center of the Fuji Five Lakes, and is a base for sightseeing on the northern foot of Mt. Fuji that is home to many hotels and inns. Lake Kawaguchiko is also noted for a view of Mt. Fuji from its northern shore, where the reflecting image may be seen on the surface of the lake water. Also, a superb view of the lake can be obtained here from Mt. Tenjo by taking a ropeway up from the eastern shore.

Itchiku Kubota Art Museum (久保田一竹美術館) is 25 min. by bus or 10 min. by taxi from Kawaguchiko Sta. Muromachi Period dyeing techniques expressed in a modern way. The Tsujigahana dyed kimono is a must-see. Hours: 9:30–17:30 (Apr.–Nov.), 10:00–16:30 (Dec.–Mar.). Closed: Tue. in Dec.–Sep. (open when Tue. falls on a national holiday) & Dec. 26–29. Admission: ¥1,300.

Kawaguchiko Museum of Art (河口湖美術館) is 10 min. by bus from Kawaguchiko Sta., then 10 min. walk. Pictures, prints, and photographs are exhibited around the theme of Mt. Fuji. Hours: 9:30–17:00. Closed: Tue. (except Jun.–Aug. ; open when Tue. falls on a national holiday), year-end & maintenance periods. Admission: ¥800.

Lake Kawaguchiko Excursion Ship (河口湖遊覧船) is a European style cruising ship which makes a 20-min. tour of the lake. Operation: 9:00–16:30 every 30 min. (–17:30 in summer, 9:30–16:00 in winter). Fare: ¥1,000 (child: ¥500).

■ Lake Saiko

Lake Saiko (西湖) has a quiet atmosphere, and its southwestern shore borders on a forest known as Aokigahara Jukai (Aokigahara Sea of Trees). It is a mysterious place where one can fully appreciate the abundant nature around the foot of Mt. Fuji. Lake Saiko is the second smallest lake next to Lake Shojiko.

■ Lake Shojiko

Lake Shojiko (精進湖), with a circumference of 5km, is the smallest lake of the Fuji Five Lakes. Hotels and inns are concentrated around its north shore, while the south shore is home to a guesthouse village. The view of Mt. Fuji from the lake's north shore is spectacular.

■ Lake Motosuko

Lake Motosuko (本栖湖) boasts one of the greatest water depths of all of Japan's lakes, while the exquisite view of Mt. Fuji from its north shore is depicted on the 1,000 yen banknote. There is not as much tourist development here as there is around the other four lakes, but one can enjoy the tranquility of nature. There is pristine wilderness here, especially around the west shore.

Lake Motosuko Excursion Ship (本栖湖遊覧船) leaves from the pier on the southeast shore of Lake Motosuko, 5 min. walk from Lake Motosuko bus stop. Part of the ship's bottom is glass and enjoy a view through the highly clear lake water in a 25-min. cruise. Operation: 9:30–15:30 every 40 min on Sat., Sun. and national holidays from mid Mar. to late Nov. The service is suspended from Dec. to mid Mar. Fare: ¥1,000 (child: ¥500).

■ Lake Yamanakako

Lake Yamanakako (山中湖) is the largest lake of the five lakes and is situated at the highest point among them, at 982 m. There are many lakefront shops and restaurants, mainly in Asahigaoka. This is one of Japan's most popular resort areas, which is home to a string of pensions and guesthouses.

Lake Yamanakako Excursion Ship (山中湖遊覧船) leaves from the Asahigaoka pier on the south shore and from the Yamanakako pier on the northwest shore. A 25-min. bus ride from Mt. Fuji Sta. to Yamanaka Nakayado or Asahigaoka bus stop. The ship circumnavigates the lake in 25 minutes. Operated: 9:30–16:15 (9:00–17:00 in summer) The service is suspended from Dec. (except weekends and holidays) to Feb. Fare: ¥1,000 (child: ¥500).

The KABA (hippo) bus is an amphibious bus offering audio-guided tours in 4 languages both on the land and the water (15 min. each, total of 30 min.). It leaves from Asahigaoka bus terminal. The fares are ¥2,300 for an adult, ¥1,150 for a child over 4 years old, and ¥400 for an infant from 0 to 3 years old (with no seat). There are 7-9 tours daily. Tours should be booked in advance, but will be cancelled in case of bad weather. The service dates, fares, and departure times may vary depending on the season. Hana no Miyako Park (花の都公園) is located on a plateau of 1,000 meters above sea level, and you can enjoy various kinds of flower with Mt. Fuji view across the field from April to October. 15 min. walk from Hananomiyako-koen bus stop (30 min by bus from Fujisan Sta. or 45 min. by bus from Gotemba Sta.). Hours: 8:30–17:30 (Apr. 16–Oct. 15), 9:00–16:30 (Oct. 16–Apr. 15). Closed: Tue. in Dec.–Mar. (except holidays). Admission: ¥500 (child: ¥200; Apr. 16–Oct. 15), ¥300 (child: ¥120; Oct. 16–Nov. 30 & Mar. 16–Apr. 15).

■ Asagiri Highland

Asagiri Highland (朝霧高原) is the name of the verdant meadowlands stretching across the foot of the west side of Mt. Fuji. A place renowned for dairy farming in Japan, an altitude of between 700–1,000 m accounts for the cool summer there, making it an ideal spot for recreation and sports.

Shiraito Falls (白糸の滝) is 20 min. by bus from Fujinomiya Sta. Falling from a 200m-wide cliffside, these falls derive their name shiraito (white threads) from the beautiful way they remind the viewer of strands of silk.

Lake Tanuki (田貫湖), 13 min. by taxi from Shiraito Falls, is a pretty human-made lake whose water reflects an inverted image of Mt. Fuji.

Fujisan Hongu Sengen-Taisha Shrine (富士山本宮浅間大社) Approx. 10 min. walk from JR Fujinomiya Sta. Founded in 806, this shrine is the headquarters of more than 1,300 Sengen-jinja shrines all over Japan. The area above the 8th station on Mt. Fuji belongs to the shrine, and the Okumiya inner shrine is located on the summit. The central shrine was built by Shogun Tokugawa Ieyasu and is designated Important Cultural Property.

■ Mt. Fuji 5th Station (富士山五合目)

Mt. Fuji's 5th Station on the Yoshida Trail is located at 2,305 m above sea level and is accessible by bus via the Fuji Subaru Line road. There are also 5th stations on each climbing trail of Fujinomiya, Gotemba and Subashiri. Many tourists, who are not there to climb, also visit the 5th Station where Mt. Fuji's summit is distinctly visible. Many bustling souvenir shops and restaurants can be enjoyed there.

■ Climbing Mt. Fuji (富士登山)

Mt. Fuji, the highest mountain in Japan, stands at a height of 3,776 m. The average temperature at the summit is 4.9 °C (40.8F) in July and 6.2 °C (43.2F) in August, with sudden snowfall in summer. It is officially open to climbers from July to early September. The most recommended way is to start climbing in the afternoon, spend the night near the summit and start climbing again early morning to watch the sunrise from the summit. It takes about 6 hrs. from the 5th Station to the summit, 3–4 hrs. from the summit to the 5th Station. Considered a sacred mountain in the Edo Period, Mt. Fuji is still climbed by groups of worshippers. Please note that a certain amount of effort should be made, such as the preparation of waterproof clothes and footwear for cold / bad weather, enough drinking water, durable snacks, headlamp, garbage bag, small money for restrooms and other facilities. Mountain huts (open Jul–Aug.) are so crowded that guests are required to share a room. If you plan to lodge in a hut, advance reservation is highly recommended.

[For descent] Summit — 1.5km, 30 min. — 8th Station — 4.5km, 1 hr. 30 min. — Sunabarai 5th Station — 30 min. — Subashiri Trail 5th Station — 55 min. by bus — Gotemba Sta.

[Good to know] Admission and opening times at tourist attractions:

- Last entry to the most of attractions is 30 min. before the closing time.
- In general, if their weekly closing day (most are on Mon.) falls on a national holiday, they are open on the day and are closed on the following day after the holiday(s).
- Most are closed throughout / a part of New Year holiday period (especially Dec. 29–Jan. 3).
