

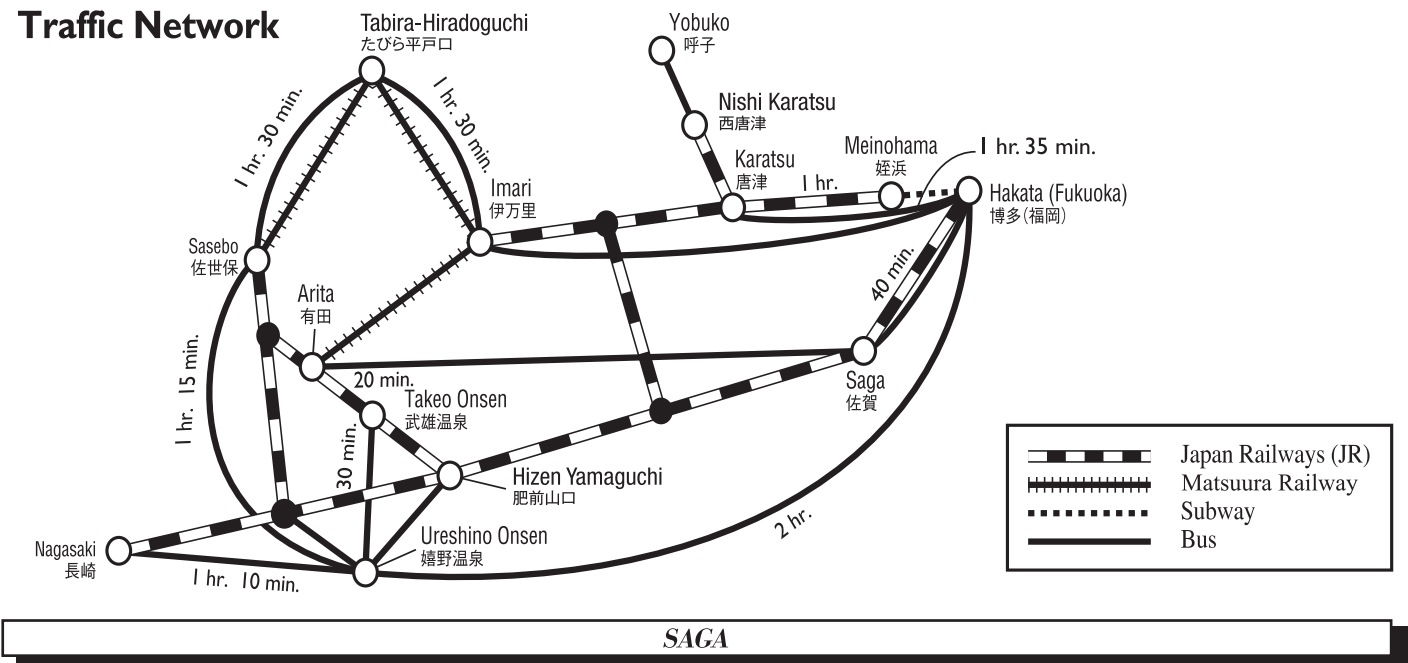

Saga (佐賀), pop. 232,580 (as of Oct. 2019), is the capital of Saga Prefecture, located at the northwestern part of Kyushu Island. The city was prosperous in the Edo Period (1603–1867) under the castle of the Nabeshima clan. The city and its surroundings are blessed with natural beauty, agricultural products, hot springs and noted for their ceramic art. Saga is also famous for the International Balloon Fiesta, one of the largest balloon festivals in Asia with over 100 balloons through the period, from the end of Oct. for a week.

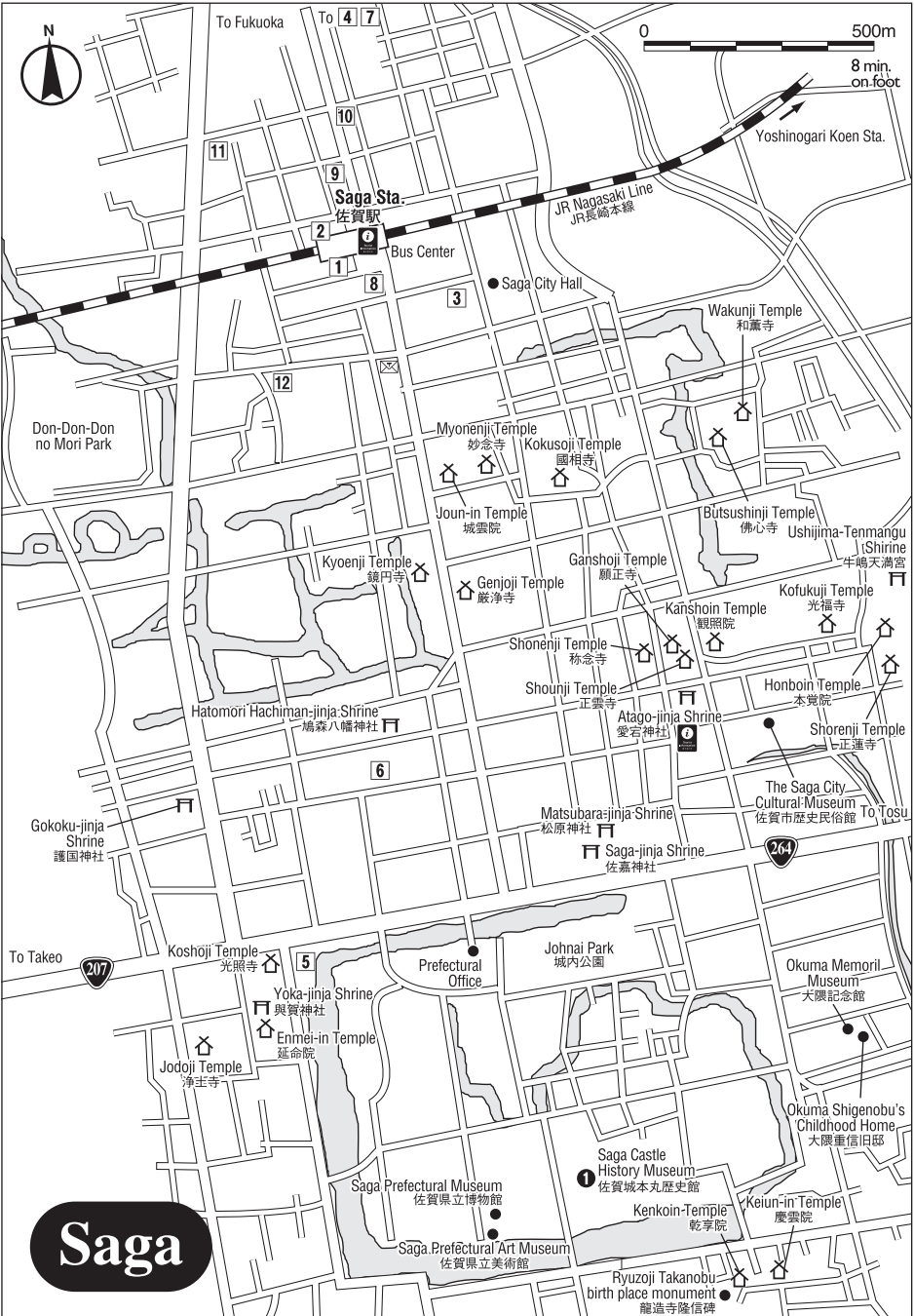

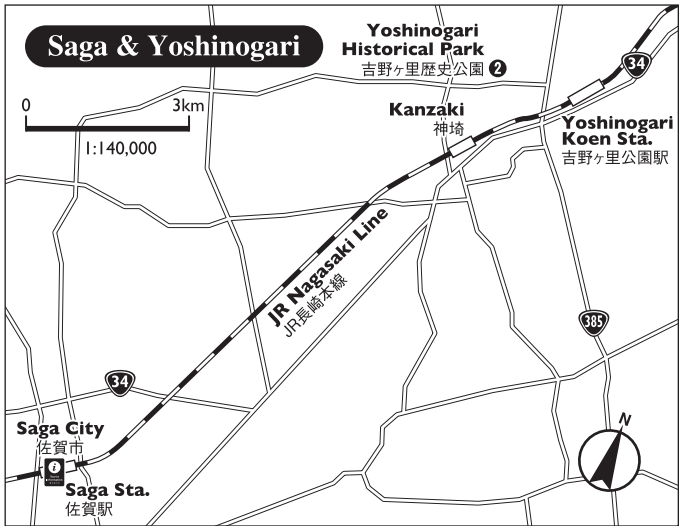
Places of Interest:

❶ Saga Castle History Museum
(佐賀城本丸歴史館) 10 min. by bus from Saga Sta, is the largest wooden restoration of a castle in Japan. The exhibits will make you understand that Saga played a important role in modernizing Japan. Though almost all the buildings were destroyed in the Saga Revolt (1874), Shachi-no-mon gate and some stone walls still remain. Admission is free, but donation is kindly requested.
Hours: 9:30–18:00. Closed: Dec. 29–31.

❷ Yoshinogari Historical Park
(吉野ヶ里歴史公園), 15 min. walk from Yoshinogari-Koen Sta., is an extensive park in which a Yayoi-Period (B.C. 3rd century to A.D. 3rd century) village with circular moats, watchtowers and build-ings for different purposes has been reproduced based on the excavated ruins. An excarvation work is still going on in the park.
Hours: 9:00–17:00, –18:00 (Jun.–Aug.). Closed: Dec. 31, the 3rd Mon. & Tue. in Jan. Admission: ¥460.

Karatsu (唐津), pop. 121,385 (as of Nov. 2019), is a port city in the center of the Genkai Quasi-National Park with magnificent seashores. Karatsu also boasts a castle. In addition, the city is blessed with natural and beautiful scenery, and good bathing beaches. Its mild climate throughout the year is an invaluable asset.

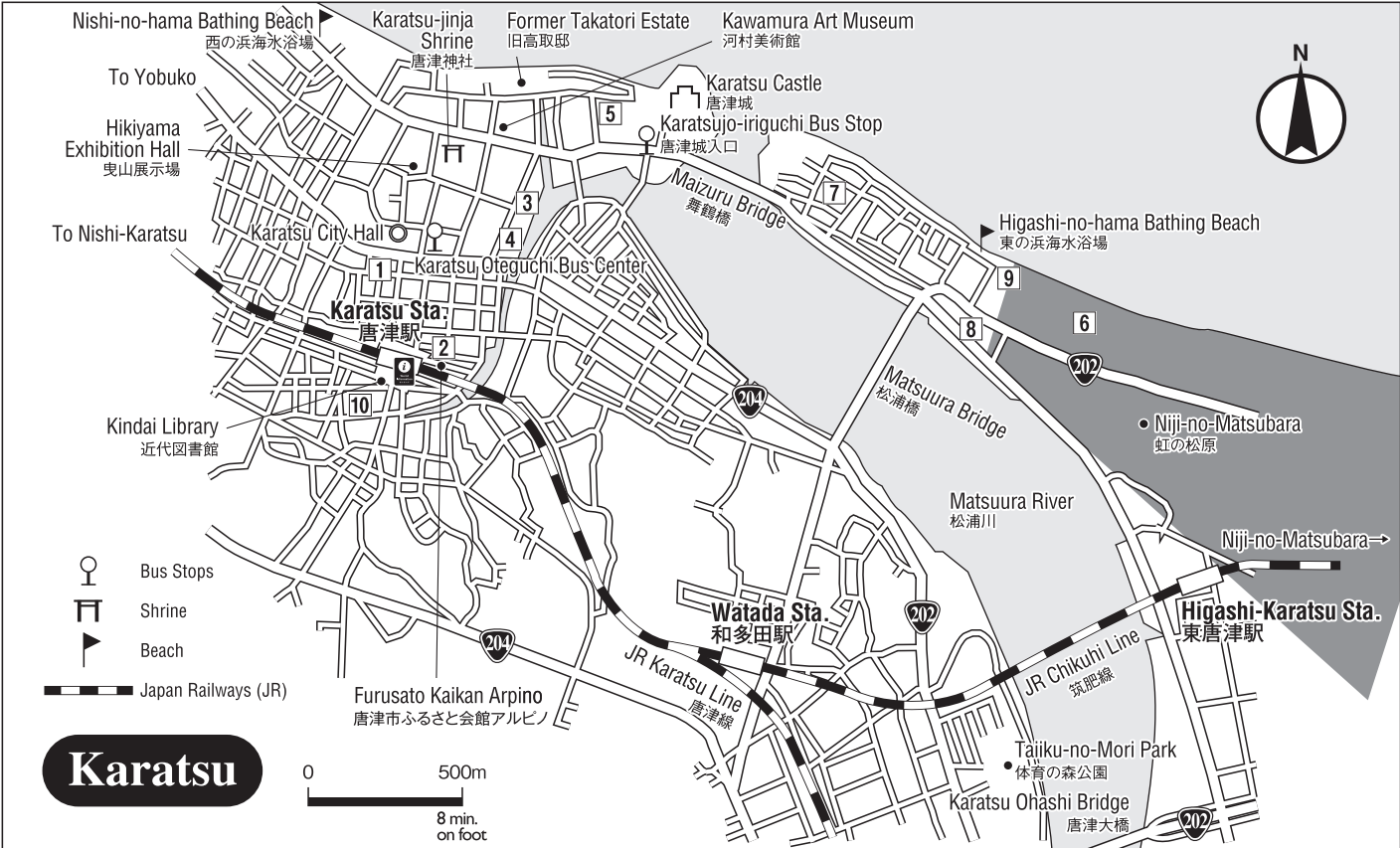

Places of Interest:

❶ Karatsu Castle (唐津城), 20 min. walk from JR Karatsu Sta. or take the city loop bus (east line) to Karatsujo-iriguchi bus stop, was built in 1608 by the feudal lord of Karatsu. Its donjon, reconstructed in 1966 and refurbished in 2017, gives a good command of the entire city. Old Karatsu ware and local archaeological material are on display inside the castle. The entire castle area forms a park (Maizuru Park) and is a noted flower-viewing place for cherry blossoms and azalea bushes. Hours: 9:00–17:00 (enter by 16:40). Closed: Dec. 29–31. Admission: ¥500.

❷ Former Takatori Estate (旧高取邸), 5 min. walk from Jonai-ninomon bus stop on the city loop bus route (east line), is the residence of Koreyoshi Takatori who is well known as an owner of coal mines in the area in early 1900’s, designated as an Important Cultural Property. The estate consists of two huge Japanese style wooden houses with remarkable interior design influenced both by western and Japanese authentic cultures. Hours: 9:30–17:00. Closed: Mon. (or the following day after the holiday when Mon. fall on a national holiday). & Dec. 29–Jan. 3. Admission: ¥520.

③ Niji-no-Matsubara (虹の松原) or Rainbow Pine Grove, a 5-min. walk from Higashi-Karatsu Sta. or short walk from Niji-no-Matsubara Sta. on JR Chikuh line to the premise, where more than a million old pine trees stretch along a few-hundred-meter wide and almost a 5-km long seaside road designated as a Special Place of Scenic Beauty. This picturesque beach has swimming and camping grounds and a People's Lodge ("Kokumin Shukusha") as well as excellent hotels.

④ Mt. Kagamiyama (鏡山), alt. 284 m, behind the central part of the Niji-no-Matsubara Beach, gives a panoramic view of the white Karatsu Castle and the city's main areas. It is also accessible in a 15-min. by taxi from Higashi-Karatsu Sta.

⑤ Hikiyama Tenjiro (Float Exhibition Hall 曳山展示場), 15 min. walk from Karatsu Sta., is where 14 gorgeous floats of Karatsu Kunchi Festival (Nov. 2–4) are on exhibit. Hours: 9:00–17:00 (enter by 16:40). Closed: Dec. 29–31, first Tue. & Wed, in Dec. & during Karatsu Kunchi Festival. Admission: ¥310.

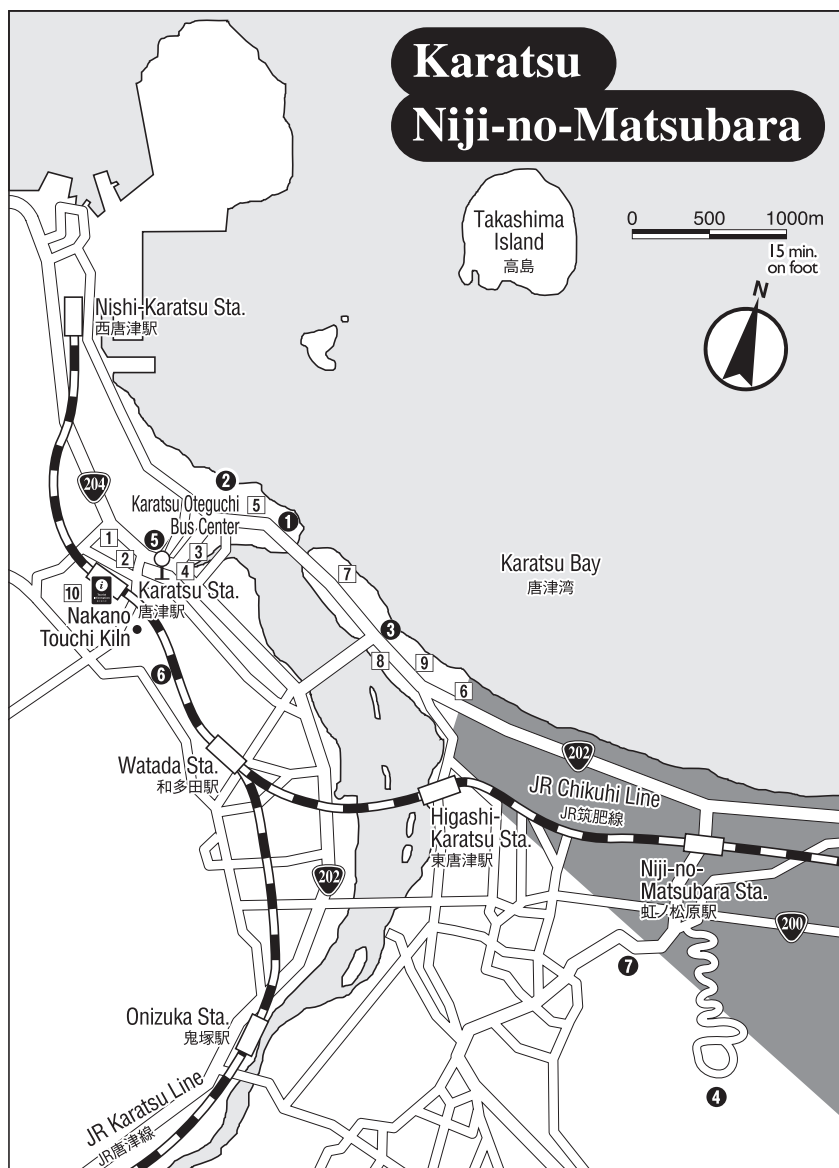
⑥ Nakazato Taroemon Kiln (中里太郎右衛門窯): A 5-min. walk from Karatsu Sta. Only the exhibition hall can be entered, is located in Choda. Tel. (0955)72-8171. Hours: 9:00–17:30.

⑦ Kyozan Kiln (鏡山窯): 10 min. walk from Niji-no-Matsubara Sta. The entire pottery-making process can be observed. Reservations are required. Tel. (0955)77-2131. Hours: 9:00–17:30.

Karatsu-yaki (唐津焼) ceramic ware, characterized by its sober color, can be closely examined through visits to kilns or exhibition halls attached to more than 20 of the kilns in the city.

Takeo Onsen (武雄温泉), on JR Sasebo Line, 82 km from Hakata (Fukuoka), is famed as a hot spring resort as well as a post town from early days.

Places of Interest:

Mifuneyama Rakuen (御船山楽園), 5 min. by taxi from Takeo Onsen Sta., at the foot of Mt. Mifune (alt. 207 m), is a most spectacular Japanese garden where the villa of the feudal lord Nabeshima used to exist. There are a large number of cherry and wisteria trees and more than 50,000 azalea bushes in the garden. Hours: 8:00–17:30. Admission: ¥400, ¥600 (during Flower Festival).

Public Onsen (武雄温泉共同浴場), with the vermilion-colored gate tower located here serving as a symbol of the city. There are 6 public hot-spring baths.

Motoyu: Hours: 6:30–24:00. Admission: ¥450.

Horaiyu: Hours: 6:30–21:30. Admission: ¥450.

Saginoyu: Hours: 6:30–24:00. Admission: ¥680.

Tonosamayu: Hours: 16:00–21:00.

Admission: ¥3,800 (per room per an hour; reservation basis).

Karoyu: Hours: 16:00–21:00.

Admission: ¥3,000 (per room per an hour; reservation basis).

Tsukazakitei: Hours: 16:00–21:00.

Admission: ¥3,400 (per room per an hour; reservation basis).

Saga Prefecture Space & Science Museum (県立宇宙科学館), 10 min. by bus from Takeo Onsen Sta. to Nagashima bus stop and 15 min. walk, is a museum where you can experience space science through the 4K planetarium and the special equipments. Hours: 9:15–17:15 (weekdays), –18:00 (Sat., Sun., & national holidays). Admission: Museum + Planetarium ¥930. Closed: Mon. (except national holidays, the beginning of May, during school holidays in spring & summer).

Keishuen (慧園), 5 min. by bus bound for Ureshino Onsen from Takeo Onsen Sta. to Karekino-to, is an extensive Japanese-style garden with a magnificent landscape. The garden is especially worth visiting in May for azaleas and in November for autumnal tints. Hours: 9:00–17:00. Closed: Wed (Jun. to Sep. and Dec. to Mar.) Admission: ¥600.

Ureshino Onsen (嬉野温泉), is another thriving Onsen (hot spring), hemmed in by hills covered with tea fields 14 km south of Takeo Onsen (30 min. by bus). Many big modern hotels stand in a row along both sides of the Ureshino River. The Onsen enjoys abundant hot-spring water. Ureshino is also noted for its Japanese tea production.

Places of Interest:

Hyakunen-no-yu (百年の湯), short walk from Bus Center is a public hot-spring bath in Ureshino. Hours: 9:00–22:00. Admission: ¥570 on weekdays / ¥670 on weekends and holidays. Also, many Ryokans open their hot-spring baths to visitors with a fee.

Ninja Village Hizen Yume Kaido (元祖忍者村肥前夢街道), 25 min. by bus bound for Ureshino Onsen from Takeo Onsen Sta. to Kokaido-mae and 10-min. walk, is an amusement park modeled after a town along the Nagasaki Kaido, a major route which ran through the region in the 17th century (Edo Period). It offers various hands-on attractions such as Syuriken (throwing knives), maze, pottery as well as Ninja house. Hours: 9:00–16:00, –17:00 (Sat., Sun. & national holidays). Admission: ¥1,100 (adults), ¥600 (children).

Yutoku Inari-jinja Shrine (祐徳稲荷神社), 35 min. by bus from Takeo Onsen, is numbered among one of the three grandest Inari-jinja Shrines. It is noted for its beautiful vermilion-lacquered buildings and the gorgeous tower-gate.

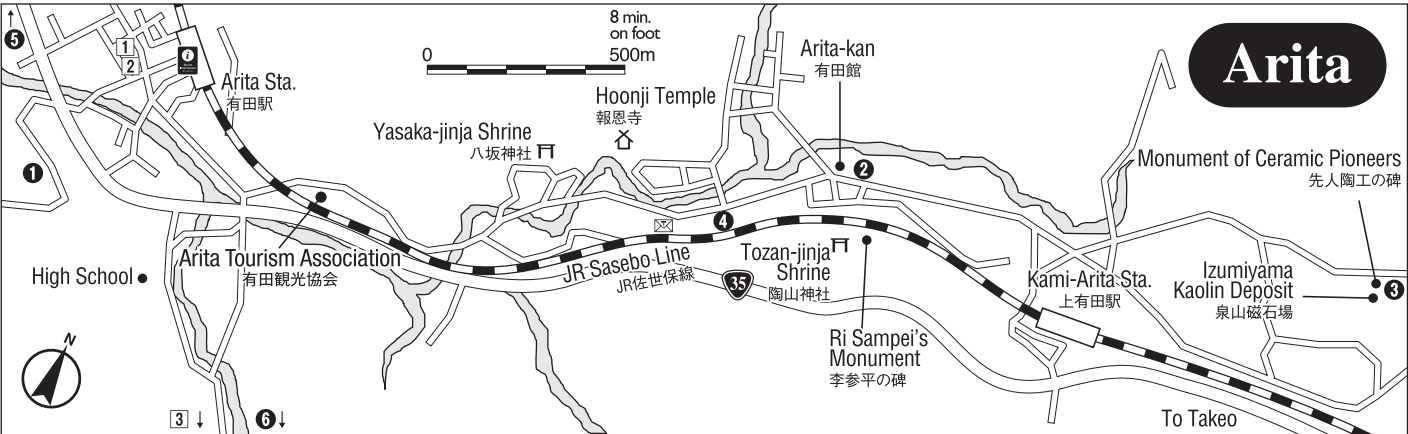

Arita (有田) is noted for its production of the world famous Ko-Imari (Old Imari porcelain) based on a Korean technique. There are about 150 kilns in this small ceramic town with a history of over 400 years.

Sightseeing by Bicycle:

5 rent-a-cycle stations are in Arita including those near JR Arita Sta. and Kami-Arita Sta. You can rent a bicycle and return it (normal type only) any stations you like. Hours: 9:00–17:00. Rental fee: From ¥500.

Places of Interest:

- 1 The Kyushu Ceramic Museum** (佐賀県立九州陶磁文化館): 12 min. walk from Arita Sta. A wide variety of Arita wares including Ko-Imari are on display. Hours: 9:00–17:00. Closed: Mon. (When Mon. falls on a national holiday, it is open) & Dec. 29–31.

2 Arita Ceramic Art Museum (有田陶磁美術館): 15 min. walk from Kami-Arita Sta. Many old and new examples of Arita ceramic works are on display. Hours: 9:00–16:30 Closed: Mon. & Dec. 29–Jan. 3. Admission: ¥100.

- 3 History and Folklore Museum of Arita** (有田町歴史民俗資料館): 15 min. walk from Kami-Arita Sta. Display of Old Imari and other ceramics of the region as well as historic documents. Hours: 9:00–16:30. Closed: Dec. 29–Jan. 3. Admission: ¥100.

4 Imaemon Museum of Ceramic Antiques (今右衛門古陶磁美術館), where Nabeshima and Imari wares are on display. Hours: 10:30–16:30. Closed: Mon., Dec. 29–Jan. 6. Admission: ¥300.

5 Kakiemon Kiln (柿右衛門窯): 35 min. walk from Arita Sta. Only the exhibition hall is open to the public. Hours: 9:00–17:00. Closed: New Year’s holidays.

6 Arita Porcelain Park, Nonnokono-sato (有田ポーセリンパーク・のんのこの郷), 8 min. by taxi from Arita Sta., has attractions such as a display of Arita ceramic works and a hands-on pottery studio, as well as a reproduction of the Zwinger Palace in Germany, where a collection of Meissen porcelain, including some displayed items in Expo 1873 Vienna, can be seen. In adjoining Sake factory, a factory tour and Sake tasting are available (advance reservation is required). Hours: 9:00–17:00, Admission: Free.

Ceramic Fair: Apr. 29–May 5
The site can be easily reached from Arita Sta. and Kami-Arita Sta. Over 500 dealers participate in this fair.

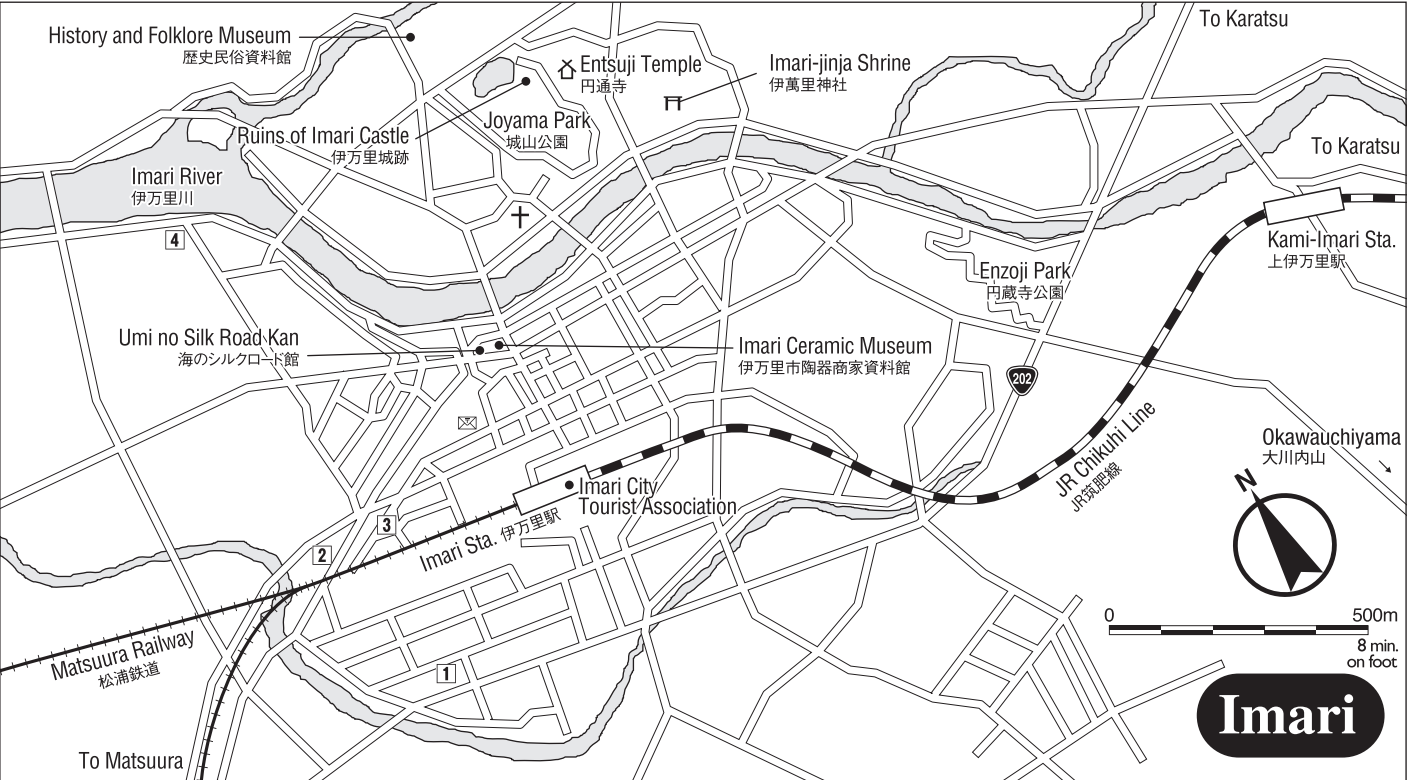
Imari (伊万里), 13 km from Arita, 25 min. by train on Matsuura Railway Nishi-Kyushu Line is a ceramic town. Imari ware is famous for its elegant color sense of red, green and yellow tones. Its body is characterized by its whiteness and comb-shaped inscription. There are 60 kilns, 30 of them are in the city center, and another 30 in Okawachiyama in the southern part of the city.

Sightseeing by Bicycle:
Rent-a-cycles are available for ¥500 at Matsuura Railway Imari Sta. Hours: 9:00–18:00.

Places of Interest:
Okawachiyama (大川内山), village of the Secret Kilns, owned by the feudal lord of Nabeshima, is a secluded area surrounded by mountains, and is accessible in 15 min. by taxi or bus from Imari Sta.

Imari Arita Traditional Crafts Center (伊万里・有田焼伝統産業会館), short walk from Okawachiyama Bus Stop, displays Imari and Arita wares. Hours: 9:00–17:00. Closed: Dec. 29–Jan. 3.

Imari Nabeshima Ware Hall (伊万里鍋島焼会館), displays and sale of Imari ware. There is a cafe, where you can drink the coffee with Imari ware. Hours: 9:00–17:30.
