Tourists are welcome, but these baths are used mainly by local residents as a part of their daily life. Please observe Japanese bathing etiquette as you enjoy a traditional public bath in the company of friendly local people. When you stay at any one of the 14 ryokans, which are members of "Wafu Mura", you can buy a pass for ¥1,000. If the person holding the pass goes to more than five of these ryokans' hotsprings, they can get Japanese clogs as a memento. (¥700 per bath per house.)

An ashiyu is easy way to experience a relaxing hot spring soak with your clothes on. At certain spots, you can drink potable hot spring water; this is supposed to be good for the stomach.


