Kosoyu (Public Bath)

Yamashiro Onsen's public bathhouse recreates the typical atmosphere reflecting the turn of the 20th century and makes artful use of the finest local crafts such as lacquerware, ceramics and stained glass.

Hashitate Fishing Port

One of the foremost fishing ports located on the coast of Sea of Japan, the Hashitate port provides stalls and hotels with numerous species of fish, seafood and delicacies such as the wintertime snow crab and sweet shrimp.

Cherry Blossoms and Riverboat Cruises

Slowly drifting through the feudal town of Daishoji, traditional riverboat cruises take the passengers back to a bygone era and offer a rare view of the splendid alleys of cherry trees in full bloom.

Mount Hakusan

Majestically standing over the area, Mount Hakusan is one of Japan's three sacred mountains. Still a potentially active volcano, it is the mother of the countless hot springs that have been providing delight and soothing to the locals for centuries.



Lake Shibayama

Gracefully adorned by the Ryohaku mountain range skyline, Lake Shibayama sees the sun rising from behind Mount Hakusan and setting beyond the nearby Sea of Japan. Bathed in sunlight, the water is said to change its color as the hours go by, and the sun travels its course.



Kakusenkei

Stretching past graceful cascades and luminous clearings, Kakusenkei is a picturesque and colorful walking path along the shores of the Daishoji river gorge that has splendid scenes in every season.



Yamanaka Lacquerware

Widely acclaimed for its ascetic beauty focusing on the expressive qualities of the wood grain, Yamanaka lacquerware is deeply linked to the area's hospitality tradition and is one of the area's most refined crafts.

Snow Crab

As the waters of the Sea of Japan become colder, myriads of crabs migrate down from northern snowy regions. Hauled in by fishermen along the coasts, this extremely popular winter delicacy is sold during picturesque night auctions at the port in Hashitate.



Artisanal Sake

Thanks to Mount Hakusan providing great amounts of clear water, as well as to the commitment of highly talented brewers, Kaga's artisanal sake production has acquired a wide recognition for its variety of tastes and characters.



Geisha at Yamanaka-Za Theater

Yamanaka-za is an elegant building with lattice walls and lacquered pillars located in the center of Yamanaka Onsen. Being the town's theater hall, its stage regularly hosts traditional dances and geisha performances.

Kutani Porcelain

One of Kaga's emblematic crafts, Kutani Porcelain is considered one of Japan's most spectacularly decorative porcelain styles. With nearly 360 year history, it has evolved to cover a wide range of artistic approaches and characters.



Duck Meat

Seldom eaten in other parts of Japan, wild ducks are still hunted in Kaga following an ancient method. The incomparable taste of the meat stands out whether it is simmered with seasonal vegetables and wasabi(Kaga jibun) or cooked in a hot pot.

Rabbit Village
