Morioka (盛岡), an old castle town founded by the feudal lord "Nambu" in 1590, is now the center of politics, economy and culture in Iwate Prefecture. Morioka boasts historical attractions and scenic wonders.

Sanriku Fukko (Reconstruction) National Park (三陸 復興国立公園) extends for 250 km along the Pacificcoast from the southern part of Aomori Prefecture to Ishinomaki City, Miyagi prefecture. This coastal park is made up of two parts—the northern part filled with sea-eroded high cliffs and fantastic rock formations, and the southern half characterized by a typical Rias-type coast.

MORIOKA

Places of Interest:

Morioka City (盛岡市) is the prefectural capital with a population of 292,428 (Sep. 2019). Morioka, once called a "Kyoto of Michinoku (northern Japan)", well preserves the past. Old temples and shrines as well as merchant houses remain intact in the city. But the city is now becoming a modern city at a rapid pace. Its lively shopping and amusement streets are Odori and Saien with a cluster of department stores, restaurants and souvenir shops. The Nakatsugawa River, a symbol of the city, meanders calmly through the heart of the city. To the north of the city, there are Mts. Atagoyama and Iwayama commanding a bird's-eye view of the whole city.

Morioka Castle Site Park (盛岡城跡公園), 7 min. by bus or a 25-min. walk from Morioka Sta., is the site of the former Morioka Castle. It is now an oasis for the citizens. Takuboku Ishikawa (1886–1912), a wellknown poet who spent his younger days in this city, loved the site and wrote several poems about it. Nakatsugawa River Banks (中津川河畔) are wonderful for strolling. Especially in the portion between the Bishamon-bashi and Kami-no-hashi Bridges, the time-honored Iwate Bank building and "Gozaku" (a series of old shops) stand as they were in older times. What may interest you are "Giboshi" or bronze ornamental knobs of the posts of the Kami-no-hashi Bridge, which was constructed several centuries ago.

Morioka Central Public Hall (盛岡市中央公民館) was once the ruling Nambu Clan's villa and preserves an exquisite Japanese strolling garden. 15 min. by bus from Morioka Sta. (Get off at Chuo Kominkan Mae.) Open: 9:00–21:00 (Tue.–Sat.) –17:00

(Sun. & National holidays.). Closed: Mon. (or the follwing day after the holiday when Mon. falls on a national holiday), Dec. 29–Jan. 3. [Japanese garden] Open: From sunrise to sunset. Closed: Dec. 29–Jan. 3. Admission: Free.


Morioka History and Culture Museum (もりおか歴史文化館), the city's main facility, is based on the concept of "Morioka Castle and castle town field museum". It preserves and exhibits materials related to the history and culture of Morioka. Access: 20 min. walk from JR Morioka Sta. Located in Morioka Castle Site Park. Open: 9:00–19:00, −18:00 (Nov.—Mar.). Closed: 3rd Tue. (or the follwing day after the holiday when 3rd Tue. falls on a national holiday), New Year holiday. Admission: ¥300.

The 500 Buddhist Disciples (五百羅漢) Buddhist statues, each with a different facial expression, line up inside **Hoonji Temple** in the temple district of Kitayama. Open: 9:00–16:00. Admission: ¥300. 12 min. by bus from Morioka Sta. (Get off at Kitayama 5 min. walk.).

Places to Visit in the Vicinity:

Koiwai Farm (小岩井農場), 30 min. by bus from Morioka Sta., is the largest privately owned ranch in this country, covering 3,000 ha. at the southern foot of Mt. Iwate. In this amusement ranch park, there are stables, a factory of dairy products and a restaurant.

Tsunagi Spa (つなぎ温泉), 30 min. by bus from Morioka Sta. It is a secluded mountain spa resort with a long history. Fresh greenery and autumnal tints attract many visitors.

RIKUCHU KAIGAN COAST

Places of Interest:

Kesennuma (気仙沼), located at the southern tip of Sanriku Fukko (Reconstruction) National Park, is a thriving fishing port of Miyagi Prefecture. Oshima Island, 25 min. by boat from Kesennuma Port, has an observatory giving a fine view of the well-indented coast and small islands. On the island are a National Vacation Village and other tourist facilities.

Kamaishi (釜石) is an iron making town where the blast furnace, the first of this type in Japan, was built. The primary tourist attraction is "Kamaishi Dai-Kannon," the big statue of Kannon or Goddess of Mercy (観音像), reached in 11 min. by bus from Kamaishi Sta. This 48.5-m high statue overlooks the intricate Bay of Kamaishi. Enshrined inside are 33 small wooden Kannon statues. Admission: ¥500. Open: 9:00-17:00 (depending on seasons).

Jodogahama Beach (浄土ヶ浜) can be reached in 20 min. by bus from Miyako Sta. (Miyako is one of the largest fishing ports in Iwate Prefecture.) On the north of Miyako Bay spreads a popular beach, Jodogahama, which consists of white

igneous rocks. The color of white rocks, blue sea and green pine trees creates a scene of perfect harmony. Sightseeing boats for a tour of Jodogahama are available.

Kitayamazaki (北山崎), 25 min. by bus from Fudai Sta. or Tanohata Sta., features high cliffs and caves offering splendid

Ryusendo Cave (龍泉洞), 24 min. by bus from Iwaizumiomoto Sta. or 2 hrs. 20 min. by IR bus from Morioka Sta., is one of the three largest stalactite grottos in Japan. Noteworthy is a small lake at the bottom of the cave, 98 m. deep, filled with crystal emerald green water. Admission: ¥1,000 (including New Cave). Open: 8:30-17:00, -18:00 (May-Sep.).

Local Product:

Nambu Brand Ironware (南部鉄器): Nambu is the old name of the region centering around Morioka. "Tetsubin" (iron kettle) has been widely in use for over 400 years. Recently, "Furin" (iron wind bell) and "Bunchin" (iron paper weight) are also becoming popular as souvenirs.


