Places of Interest:

1 Naritasan Shinshoji Temple (成田山新勝寺)

Naritasan Shinshoji Temple is the headquarters of the Shingon Sect's Chizan School, built by the great priest Kancho in 940. One of three major temples in the Kanto area dedicated to Fudomyo-o, the god of fire, Shinshoji is visited by many worshippers each year. The temple also provides free volunteer-guided walk around the Temple grounds.. Naritasan Park spreads over 165,000m² with breathtaking natural beauty through the four seasons. Situated along the front approach to the temple is Narita Tourist Pavilion, which provides a visual history of Japanese vehicles including the time-honored Dashi floats featured in the Narita Gion Festival.

Naritasan Omote Sando Street (成田山表参道)

When you visit the temple, one of the enjoyable experiences is a walk on the long approach to the temple. It is pleasant to walk, sighting many shops and restaurants on the approach, including long established shops, some of which have more than 100-year histories, and 60 eel restaurants. These shops offer a wide variety of souvenirs, including Yokan (traditional Japanese sweet), Teppozuke (pickled vegetables) and Tsukudani (small fish boiled in sweetened soy sauce), as well as local "Sake" or rice wine.

2 Naritasan Museum Of Calligraphy (成田山書道美術館)

This museum is in the corner of refined Naritasan park inside of Naritasan Shinshoji Temple. Mainly exhibits the works written from the end of Edo period to the present age. Hours: 9:00–16:00. Closed: Mon. (or the following day after the holiday when Mon. falls on a national holiday) Admission: ¥500.

3 Boso-no-Mura Museum (房総のむら)

Boso-no-Mura is a 32-ha park of historic relics set in a vast red pine forest. The entire park area is spotted with a total of 120 tumulus, large and small, which is called the Ryukakuji burial mounds. The park also has a historic materials library and contains the main auditorium of the former Imperial Academy's Elementary School, an Important Cultural Property.

In adjacent Boso-no-Mura area, an open-air museum, you can see actual-size reproductions of a farmer's house, a Samurai swordsman's residence and other past Japanese structures. In one corner of Boso-no-Mura, you'll find a soba noodle plant where soba kneaders will demonstrate their traditional noodle-making skills for you. If you want, you can knead soba dough and cut it into noodles all on your own! (Please make a reservation in advance. Tel: 0476-95-3333)

Hours: 9:00–16:30. Closed: Mon. & Dec. 26-Jan. 1. Admission: ¥300 Noodle making: ¥1,400–¥1,600 / group (1–5 persons) Access from Narita Airport: 25 min. by taxi (approx. ¥5,000), or Approx. 10 min. by JR trains to JR Narita Sta., 20 min. by bus to "Ryukakuji-dai-2-chome" (竜角寺台2丁目) bus stop, and then 10 min. walk.

4 Narita Tourist Pavilion (Narita Kankokan) (成田観光館) Tel: (0476)24-3232

This pavilion uses audio-visual media to provide visitors with useful information concerning places of interest. Among the things that visitors should not miss are the many exhibits showing aspects of Japanese tradition and culture such as the two festival floats used in the Narita Gion Festival. The fashions and customs of Edo-period visitors to Naritasan Shinshoji Temple are also displayed.

Visitors can enjoy a Japanese traditional "Tea Ceremony" in English on every Thursday (10:30–12:00), and also an entertainment entitled "A Taste of Japanese Culture for You" which fea-

tures flower arrangement, kimono dressing, calligraphy, origami and koto playing on 3rd Tuesday* (10:00–12:00, 13:00–15:00) Admission: Free. *In case the Monday before the 3rd Tuesday falls on a national holiday it will be cancelled. Access: about 10 min. walk along Omote Sando Street from JR Narita Sta. Hours: 9:00–17:00. Closed: Mon. (or the following day after the holiday when Mon. falls on a national holiday) & Dec. 29–31.

5 AEON Mall Narita (イオンモール成田)

This shopping mall is one of the most convenient centers in Japan, as it is possible to shop there when staying overnight on the way to Narita Airport. Hours: 10:00–22:00. Access: 10 min. by direct bus from Keisei Narita Sta. Central Gate Bus Stop No.6 (¥210).

6 Sogo Reido Sanctuary (Toshoji Temple) (鳴鐘山東勝寺宗吾霊堂)

Sogo Reido Sanctuary is also called Meisho-zan Toshoji Temple. This temple is said to have been dedicated by Sakanoue-no Tamuramaro. He wanted to appease the souls of the war dead of the battles he experienced as the commander-in-chief of an expeditionary force to which Emperor Kammu (781-806 A.D.) dispatched him to annihilate his opponents in eastern Japan.

The temple has been called by another name, "Sogo Reido," ever since villagers enshrined Kiuchi Sogoro (later called Sogo-sama, the Hon-Sogo), who had been executed together with his wife and four children in the middle of the 17th century for directly petitioning the shogun. Sogo Goichidaikikan Hall exhibits dolls, and Sogo Reihoden exhibits mementos of this brave village headman who succeeded in convincing the shogun to reduce the excessively heavy tax levied on his villagers in exchange for giving his and his family's lives. 5 min. from Keisei-Narita Sta. to Sogo-Sando Sta. on Keisei Line and 10 min. walk.

7 National Museum of Japanese History (国立歴史民俗博物館)

This museum is Japan's only national museum for historical science, archaeology and folklore. It houses approximately 250,000 items for the study of these fields. All exhibits are well-arranged in chronological order from the primitive ages through ancient times and on to the modern period, providing a systematic view of Japan's history, culture and folklore. Surrounded with abundant greenery, the museum is located in Sakura Joshi Park, renowned for its marvelous cherry blossoms in spring.

Hours: 9:30–17:00 (Mar.–Sep.), –16:30 (Oct.–Feb.). Closed: Mon. (or the following day after the holiday when Mon. falls on a national holiday) & Dec. 27–Jan. 4. Admission: ¥600. Access from Narita Airport: 20 min. by Keisei Line to Keisei-Sakura Sta. (¥470) and 15 min. walk / 5 min. by bus (¥170). For more information: <http://www.rekihaku.ac.jp/english/index.html>

8 Sakura Buke-Yashiki (佐倉武家屋敷) or Old Samurai Houses of Sakura & Buke-Yashiki Dori (武家屋敷通り) or Samurai Houses Street

Sakura is a city which developed as a castle town in the Edo period. Today, several old samurai houses remain along the Samurai Houses Street and three of them are opened to the public. Hours: 9:00–17:00. Closed: Mon. (or the following day after the holiday when Mon. falls on a national holiday) & Dec. 28–Jan. 4. Admission: ¥210.

9 Shisui Premium Outlets® (酒々井プレミアム・アウトレット)
The outlet is located 15 min. by shuttle bus (¥360) from Narita Airport or 50 min. by direct bus (¥1,200) from JR Tokyo Sta. (Yaesu Exit). 210 outlet stores provide a fulfilling shopping experience. Hours: 10:00–20:00, 11:00–21:00 (Restaurant). Closed: 3rd Thu. in Feb.

10 Your ELM Narita (ユアエルム成田店)
Your ELM Narita is a shopping center located in front of Kozunomori Sta. on the Keisei Line. With an electronics store and 100-yen shop, it is a great place for shopping while transiting at Narita. Hours: 10:00–20:00. Access: 15 min. on the Keisei Line from Narita Airport.

11 Museum of Aeronautical Sciences (航空科学博物館)
Located adjacent to Narita International Airport, it is Japan’s first museum dedicated to aviation. It has various exhibits that include aircraft, engines, and cockpits, as well as an observation platform that affords up-close views of planes taking off and landing at Narita Airport. It also features a flight simulator that was developed for pilot training. For a fee, visitors can enter the simulator for a simulated flight from Haneda to Narita. Hours: 10:00–17:00. Closed: Mon. (or the following day after the holiday when Mon. falls on a national holiday) & Dec. 29–31. Admission: ¥700 (adult), ¥300 (junior high & high school student), ¥200 (children aged 4 and above). Access: A 10 min. bus ride from Terminal 1 (No.30). / A 14 min. bus ride from Terminal 2 (No.28A & 28C) to the Museum of Aeronautical Sciences Bus Stop.
